#### FINANCIAL UPDATE

Late last year, our Board of Directors adopted a budget that anticipated our spending to be approximately \$350,000 on children in 2021. That was an increase of around \$100,000 over the year 2020. So, we were stunned to see that we had spent \$117,000 in just the first three months of the year!

Meanwhile, our fundraising numbers were just as encouraging as we raised approximately \$209,000 in the first quarter as well. So many people and companies have stepped up and offered to raise money for us. Comedian Patton Oswalt continues to be a fundraising machine. Then there is John Walsh who, in partnership with Patton, is donating 10% of the proceeds from the audiobook of his latest book release, *The Chowderhead Crusades*. Then the national clothing chain, Standard and Strange, raised money for us through an online auction. Additionally, the award winning cartoonist, Ken Fisher, has offered to do <u>an original drawing</u> of his famous character. He is charging \$1,100 for an original framed cartoon and will donate \$1,000 to Alice's Kids!
