LATEST SPENDING REPORT

Last year, we spent \$258,000 on children across the country. This year, we have already spent \$237,000 on 2,735 children. So, we will soon break last year's record. Still, we are looking to serve even more children, so if you know a teacher, social worker or other professional who works with children please refer them to our [Request Form](#).

We recently veered away from our normal process when we donated \$3,500 to United Community, a social service agency in Northern Virginia. They had put out a request for funds to buy shoes for children in a community that they serve, and our donation allowed them to buy 100 pairs of shoes. In addition, we donated \$5,000 in gift cards to a Fairfax County (VA) school supply drive. Rest assured, however, that these are rare cases and we will continue to provide assistance one child at a time.
